

Health disparities are avoidable and unfair differences in the health of people in particular groups. These differences tend to overlap, making them difficult to address.



DISPARITIES IN HIV, MADE WORSE BY COVID-19

During the HIV epidemic there have been huge gaps in the type and quality of healthcare people get, related to age, racial, and ethnic groups, as well as between sexual and gender identities. The epidemic has been defined by the prevalence and interconnected nature of these gaps, including the stark differences in HIV outcomes.

HIV: A Disease of Disproportionate Impact



Existing health disparities for people living with HIV have worsened during COVID-19, negatively impacting access to testing, treatment, and medication adherence.



669,847 fewer HIV screening tests performed

HIV diagnoses

67,694 tests performed⁵
