

ACCELERATE Meet Me Where I Want to Be: Listening to the Men of Baltimore and Jackson.

Aligned with the National HIV/AIDS Strategy, ACCELERATE! is ViiV Healthcare's four-year, \$10 million commitment to fund innovative projects that support the health and well-being of Black gay men in two cities hardest hit by HIV—Baltimore, Maryland, and Jackson, Mississippi.

ViiV Healthcare believes that the perspectives of those most affected by HIV are essential to designing, applying, and evaluating promising projects and programs. Through this person-oriented lens, the ACCELERATE! team conducted a series of activities to better understand men's experiences through prevention, care, and treatment. There was a focus on recognizing their unique needs and aspirations, and on identifying opportunities for action and investment.

Our Process

Funded by ViiV Healthcare, ACCELERATE! began with a comprehensive literature review and environment scan to inform key questions for the ethnographic research and to establish an understanding about the contexts in which Black gay men operate—at home, in the clinic, and out in the world.

This initial work guided the in-depth **ethnographic research** conducted by ReD Associates on behalf of ViiV Healthcare. The study focused on 30 HIV- and HIV+ men, their friends, their family members, and their influencers in Baltimore and Jackson.

From here, the team brought together local communities and national advisors (2) in order to identify areas of strategic opportunity to serve as the foundation of future programming for ACCELERATE!

Our Insights

Insights from this process are structured along a four-stage HIV continuum, with insights about identity forming the background.



Men want to be treated as individuals and not as labels.

BEFORE TESTING

Intimacy and trust are important for relationships, and condoms get in the way.



Testing negative is a critical opportunity for prevention strategies.



Men distance themselves from care when care doesn't fit their needs.



Interruptions in care happen to everyone.



Our Takeaways

These insights into the HIV journey have immediate implications for strategies and messages relating to care. They show that care cannot be delivered effectively by assuming homogenous identities, by equating knowledge of disease information with action, or by ignoring men's aspirations.

- 1. Care is for everyone, not just for those who are HIV+ and in treatment. Addressing messages, clear information, and holistic strategies for everyone should result in fewer infections, more sustained care, and less stigma.
- 2. Men need a reason to enter and stay in care. Current efforts emphasize vague, abstract, or unclear goals about the long-term future, when the reasons should be clear and concrete—beating the odds, staying strong, and staying healthy.
- 3. Concrete individual benefits—rather than abstract and potentially unrealistic goals, like stopping HIV or improving society—should be emphasized.
- 4. Messages shouldn't treat Black gay men as a single, homogenous group.
- 5. With men focused on growth and self-improvement, messages need to acknowledge men's ambitions and offer them choices that are in line with those personal aspirations.
